These pictures fully represent and capture the intensity of this bond by a series of beautiful and angelic images. The background, a quiet and suggestive glimpse of the French countryside, perfectly matches with the model's angelic and innocent beauty.

The principal colour is doubtless white and the recurring use of light shades seems to underline the heavenly atmosphere of the landscape.

Natural elements are completely merged with the human being, such as in the hairstyle. The girl's soft hair is adorned by a wreath of staffs, therefore it is impossible to discern the model's hair from the wands.

Light clothes totally match with the ethereal background. The girl wears lace dresses, veils, loose shorts and low-necked tops which show a lot of the girl's pale skin.

We have two different styles of make up. The first one focuses on the eyes which are highlighted by a black line and a series of small dots which give the look an unrealistic, fairy touch. The other one really reminds me of fairytales' princesses, like Snow White. The lips are painted with a bright red and the cheeks are coloured with a soft shade of pink blush while nude colours are used on the eyes.

Nowadays it's extremely important to remind humans of the bond our specie shares with nature. This photoshoot definitely gives the idea of a perfect harmony between the model and the natural elements.









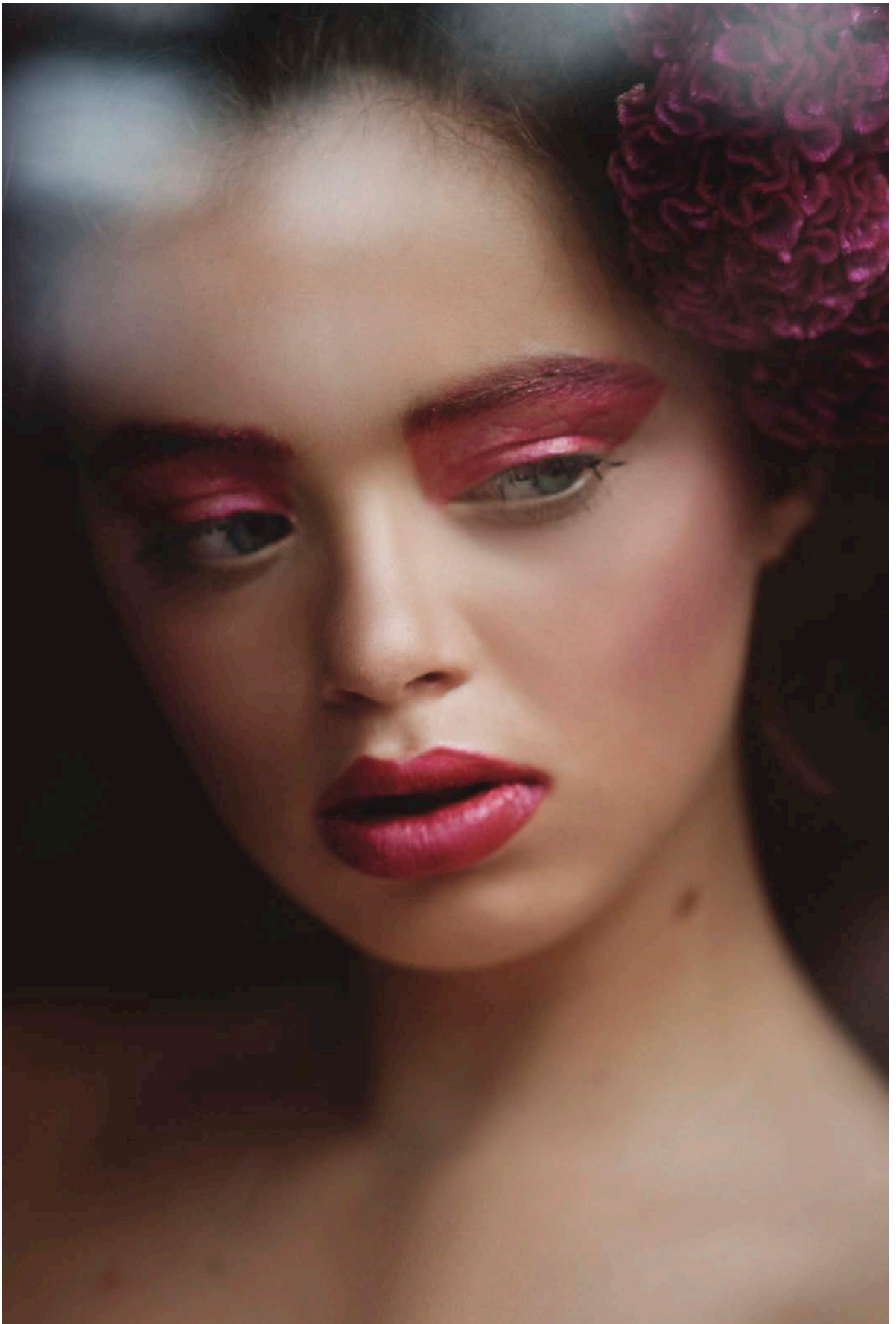
